






Dear GHLS Students, Families, Friends and Supporters,

# CANADA AND GERMANY: PARTNERS FROM IMMIGRATION TO INNOVATION: Opening Reception of the Exhibition at Pier 21 (December 2022)

The Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 held a FREE opening reception for the exhibition of Canada and Germany: Partners from Immigration to Innovation. "This exhibition displayed historical events over the centuries, inspiring stories of German immigrants, and innovative bilateral research projects and partnerships.
