

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## School Year in Review

Children and Youth Classes

We offer classes for children and youth for various levels. Lessons take place once a week for two hours on Thursday afternoons and evenings at The Shambhala School in Halifax. Children start as young as age four and are encouraged to speak German through play and music. In the children 4 and 5 classes, students can prepare for the German Language Diploma (DSD = Deutsches Sprachdiplom). The curricula for our childrens classes are based on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). The GHLS Curriculum Committee has reworked the curriculum of the children classes. Anyone interested can request a copy from the teachers or the principal.

#### German Language Certificate (Deutsches Sprachdiplom – DSD)

We had three students from the Children 5 class who took the DSD 1 exams this year. The oral exams took place on March 7, 2019 at the Shambhala school. Elke Rühl from the ZfA (Zentralstelle für Auslandschulwesen) in Toronto was present for the oral exams in March, which were conducted by Cornelia Lorenz. The written exams took place at Dalhousie on April 11, 2019. We had 100% pass rate on DSD this year. Congratualions to Tovah Clift vom Hagen, Benjamin Martens, and Maxwell Mitchell

The GHLS renewed its DSD1 certification in 2017-18 with the German Kulturminister Konferenz. The school is eligible to offer DSD1 exams until 2020. The GHLS applied for a renewal of our accreditation as a DSD 1 school. However, this time we are hopeful that the accreditation is no longer temporary but rather permanent. We are also planning to offer more test exams such as "Vergleichsarbeiten" to prepare students in Children 4 and 5 for DSD 1. We were encouraged to consider applying for the DSD2 accreditation.

#### Adult Classes

For adult students we offer German courses at various levels, where students with no prior knowledge in German are just as welcome as advanced students who want to put their German knowledge into use in the conversational classes. Most classes for adults take place Thursday evenings at The Shambhala School in Halifax. The curricula for our adult classes are also based on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and our Curriculum Committee is working on a draft for each class.

#### Scholarships

Every year the GHLS awards a scholarship to one of the children and one scholarship to an adult student to recognize their commitment. Tovah Clift vom Hagen received the Gerta-Josenhans Memorial Scholarship for the children and Ani Delice received the Eva-Huber Memorial Scholarship for the adults.

Survey Result Highlights

The GHLS conducted a survey with the teachers, parents and adult students to get input for the strategic plan. The response rate was excellent for each of the groups (between 44% and 83%). Most notable outcome was the confirmation that the location of the school, and the time and day of the week for the classes are convenient for the majority of the participants. We are also continuing to focus on the DSD.





#### 2018-19 Financial Summary



The GHLS generated a total of \$38,451 in revenue during 2018-19 compared to \$37,639 in the prior year. The majority of revenue is generated through tuitions (70%) and donations (19%).



Overall, total expenses of \$ 36,955 are comparable to the prior year (\$34,086). Teacher and helper honoraria accounted for 69% of the total expenses.
